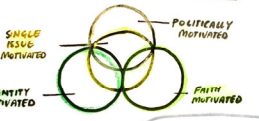

• TERRORISM: Acting on that belief of violence.



## UNDERSTANDING MOTIVATIONS BEHIND VIOLENT EXTREMISM

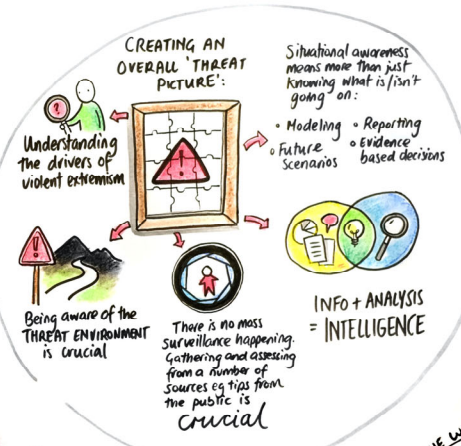


### INDICATORS OF VIOLENT EXTREMISM:

If all Communities know the signs and how to report them we can create a SAFER NEW ZEALAND

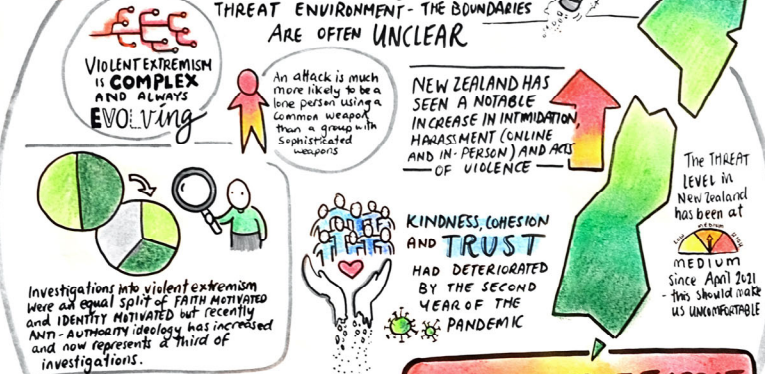

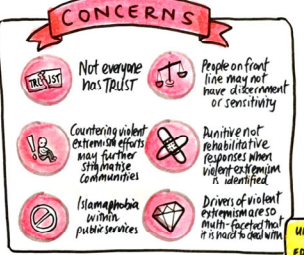
