# **GOVERNOR-GENERAL (ALLOWANCE) ORDER 2019**

## **Proposal**

This paper proposes that Cabinet authorise the submission of the Governor-General (Allowance) Order 2019 to the Executive Council. The order sets the rate of the Governor-General's allowance for expenses at \$32,883, as at 1 October 2019.

## **Policy**

- 2 Under the Governor-General Act 2010, the Governor-General must be paid an allowance for official expenses. The allowance is currently set at \$32,408 a year. The allowance is exempt income and is therefore free from income tax.
- The allowance is provided to help meet expenses incurred by the Governor-General personally in undertaking her duties.
- The allowance is adjusted annually, to reflect the percentage movement in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) between the September quarter of that year and the September quarter of the immediately preceding year.
- The movement in the CPI between the September 2018 and September 2019 quarters is a 1.5 per cent increase. This translates to an increase in the Governor-General's allowance of \$475.
- 6 Under section 6(3) of the Governor-General Act, an Order in Council setting the allowance comes into force on the date specified in the order, which may be a date that is before the date the order is made.
- 7 The permanent appropriation for the salary and allowance is in Vote Prime Minister and Cabinet, Governor-General's Salary and Allowance PLA.

## Timing and 28-day rule

A waiver of the 28-day rule is required to allow the order to come into effect on 1 October 2019, as provided for in the Act. The regulations have no effect on the public.

## Compliance

- 9 The regulations are consistent with:
  - 9.1 The principles of the Treaty of Waitangi.
  - 9.2 The rights and freedoms contained in the New Zealand Bill of Rights Act 1990 and the Human Rights Act 1993.
  - 9.3 The principles and guidelines set out in the Privacy Act 1993.

  - 9.5 The *Legislation Guidelines* (2018 edition), a publication by the Legislation Design and Advisory Committee.
