

Update on North Island Drought

Drought conditions have eased

- Climate reports show that while drought is still impacting parts of the Auckland region, drought conditions have eased across most of the upper North Island due to an increase in rainfall over recent weeks.
- There is reduced demand for water tanker deliveries in Northland.

Focus remains on water tanker deliveries as well as repairing existing tanks

- NEMA funding has supported a total of 505 tanker deliveries, including Northland (307 deliveries), Thames Coromandel (168 deliveries), Hauraki (25 deliveries) and the Bay of Plenty (5 deliveries).
- 4. Costs incurred so far are mostly associated with water tanker delivery. NEMA has also funded the cleaning of onsite water tanks to ensure that delivered water is not contaminated by silt deposits, and that onsite pipework and fittings are not blocked or damaged. Costs incurred to date total an approximate \$300,000.

NEMA officials are working closely with Iwi and local authorities to implement the \$10m drought appropriation

5. NEMA officials met with District and Regional councils, and Iwi representatives, on 17 June to discuss opportunities to access funding assistance through the drought relief package. Councils and iwi groups are committed to working together on rural "community" water supply projects which could qualify for government funding assistance, which will then be considered by NEMA officials.

Water projects undertaken prior to 11 March in response to the drought will now be considered for funding

- 6. The drought appropriation was established on 11 March 2020 by the Cabinet Economic Development Committee (DEV) with Power to Act. Far North District Council and Northland Regional Council carried out water infrastructure work in response to the drought prior to this date, and have sought support from NEMA for these costs.
- 7. The Minister of Civil Defence, after consultation with the Deputy Prime Minister and Ministers of Finance and Local Government, agreed that NEMA should consider work commenced or planned after the official declaration of the drought (11 February) to be eligible for financial assistance, provided it meets NEMA's criteria for support. This allows the Government to address the level of need in Northland more fully.
- 8. NEMA officials are working with Far North District Council on projects carried out since 11 February that may be eligible for assistance. S9(2)(i)

 If appropriations are not fully utilised, any remaining balance will not be drawn down.
