Assalamu Alaikum

Today marks three years since the devastating and unprecedented events of 15 March 2019 that resulted in the deaths of 51 people who were gathered peacefully in prayer.

The recommendations of the Royal Commission of Inquiry made it clear that we have significant work to do to create the kind of society that New Zealanders desire: one that embraces and values people of all backgrounds, races, cultures and religion.

Like many New Zealanders, I will be thinking of the 51 shaheed, their whānau, and those who were injured in the coming days. Our work honours them; and it is a privilege to be doing that work alongside you.
