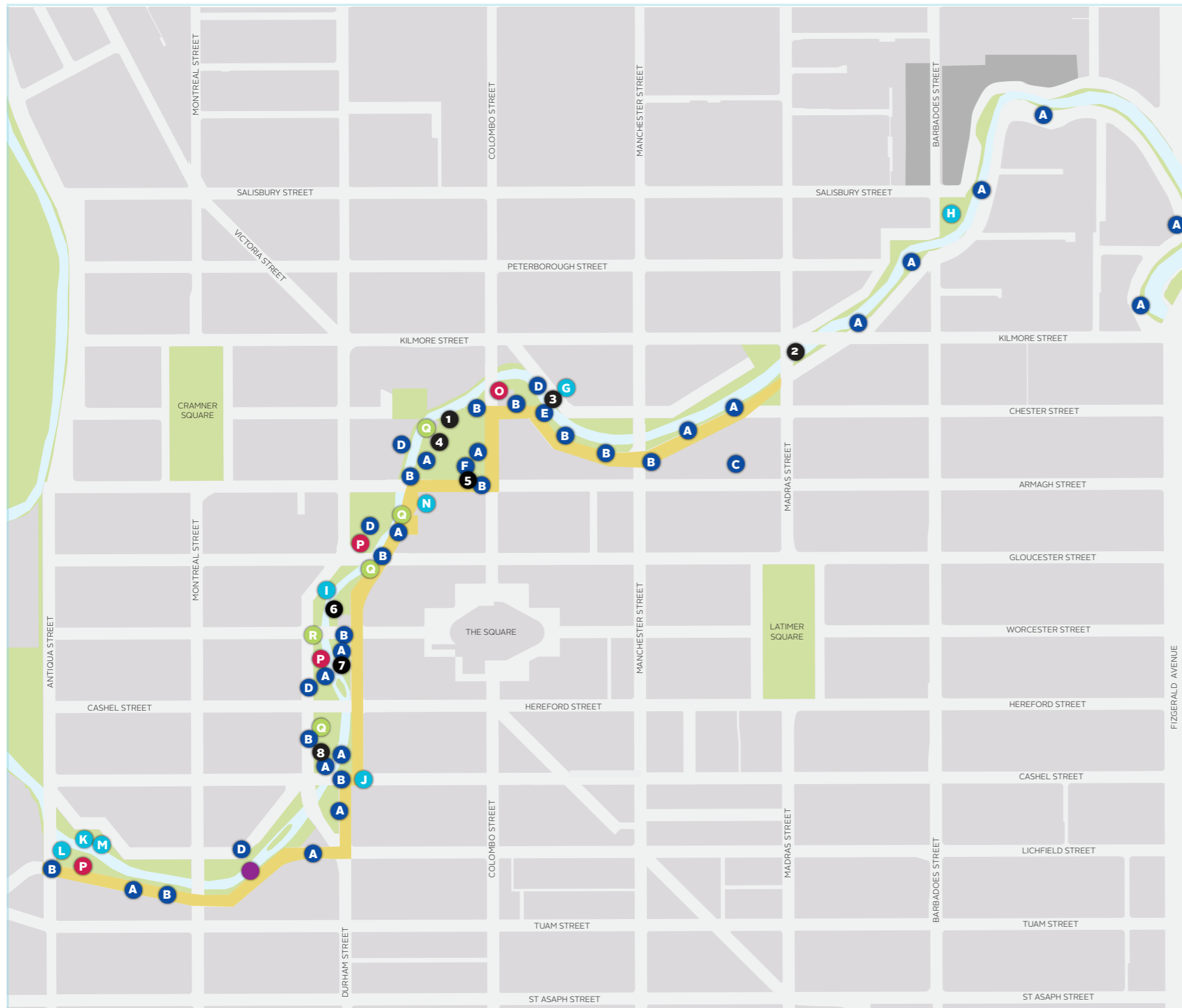


Ōtākaro | Art by the River

Key | Descriptions of the works proposed for sites along Ōtākaro/Avon River

Bespoke landscape works

- A** Literary Works - quotes and partial quotes of NZ writers, etched in stone
- B** Ngā Whāriki Manaaki - weaving patterns represented as coloured stone mosaics
- C** Story Arc - designs etched in stone in a large circle within the Margaret Mahy Family Playground
- D** Moments - bespoke seating designs
- E** Iconic Bridge - pedestrian and cycle link from the Te Papa Ōtākaro/Avon River Precinct to the East
- F** Ngāi Tūāhuriri - proposed commission

Standalone works

- G** Land-based water sculpture - proposed commission
- H** Sculpture Garden - a collection of smaller sculptural works
- I** Stay - human figure located in the river, one of two sculptures by British artist Antony Gormley
- J** Terraces Sculpture - proposed commission
- K** Pounamu - proposed commission
- L** Raupo - proposed commission
- M** Emerging Artists - proposed programme supporting new artists
- N** Convention Centre Artwork - proposed commission
