Your thinking on concepts and options

Are you asking for ideas for all red zones or just the ones in the Waimakariri District?

Currently the Government and its strategic partners (Waimakariri District Council, Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu, Environment Canterbury, Christchurch City Council and Selwyn District Council) are seeking ideas specifically for the two red zones in the Waimakariri District that's Kaiapoi and Pines/Kairaki Beaches. You can submit your ideas on either or both zones.

There will be an opportunity to provide your ideas about the red zones in Christchurch at a later date.

What difference will my ideas make in the decision in the future?

Your ideas and aspirations for the red zones are very important. Your vision will help inform the Government's final decisions on how the red zones will be used in the future.

What about people still living there - the people who didn't accept the Crown offer. Are you going to be moving people on?

It is important that residents still living in the red zones have a say about what they would like to happen there in the future. The Government will not make any decision about the remaining residents until all the options have been considered.

Who has the final say on the use of the land?

The final decisions on what will happen to the land in the red zones rest with the Government. Decisions will be made in consultation with strategic partners - Christchurch City Council, Waimakariri District Council, Selwyn District Council, Environment Canterbury and Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu.

The canvas Ideas Box


