Public Notice: Māori Reservation – 259 Governors Bay Road

The Residential Red Zone Offer Recovery Plan approved by the Minister for Canterbury Earthquake Recovery in July 2015 enables the Chief Executive of CERA, on behalf of the Crown, to make specific Crown offers to owners of residential red zone properties in at Rāpaki in the Banks Peninsula. This includes provision for setting aside the one Crown-owned property at Rāpaki, 259 Governors Bay Road, as a Māori reservation.

As part of the Māori reservation process required by the Māori Land Court, the Chief Executive of CERA has called a hui for all relevant parties with specific interest in 259 Governors Bay Road. The hui is for the purpose of deciding:

- Whether to apply to the Māori Land Court to set the land aside as a Māori reservation;
- The purpose of the Māori reservation;
- The class of beneficiaries for the Māori reservation; and
- Nomination of the trustees for the Māori reservation.
