# **Christchurch residents survey**

## [August 2012]



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### 1. Methodology

These tables are based on a telephone survey of 500 Christchurch residents.

Fieldwork was conducted between 31<sup>st</sup> July and 1<sup>st</sup> August 2012 from UMR's call centre facility located in Auckland. The table below shows the total number sampled and the corresponding margin of error:

### 2. Report

A majority of Christchurch residents were optimistic with three in five (61%) thinking things were heading in the right direction, one in five (21%) thinking things were off on the wrong track and 18% were unsure of the direction Christchurch was heading in. This compares with UMR's national data with half (51%) of New Zealanders thinking things were heading in the right direction nationally, 38% thinking things were off on the wrong track and 11% were unsure.

Respondents more likely to state things were heading in the right direction were those that believed it was a good time to invest in Christchurch (69%) and supporters of the plan to rebuild the central city area (78%). Professionals or mangers (72%) and those with over \$100,000 of household income (81%) were also more likely to believe things were heading in the right direction.

#### General awareness of rebuild

Awareness was almost universal with 95% of respondents reporting knowledge of the recent announcement by the Government and Christchurch City Council concerning the rebuilding of the central city area.

Younger respondents between 18 and 29 and those planning to leave Christchurch were least likely to have heard the announcement (86% and 85% respectively).

Just over half (52%) of those aware of the planned rebuild of the central city area claimed to have a reasonable knowledge about it, with 11% claiming to know 'a lot'. Results were similar on the opposite end with 47% of respondents reporting a low level of knowledge and 10% stating they knew 'hardly anything at all'.

Once more, younger respondents between 18 and 29 and those who were leaving Christchurch were less likely to know about the rebuild plan (39% and 38% respectively).

Respondents more likely to declare a reasonable knowledge about the rebuild plan included those that support it (59%) or have a greater household income (59% between \$70,000 - \$100,000 and 63% over \$100,000). Professionals and technicians were also more likely to declare knowledge of the plan (58% and 59% respectively).

#### Awareness of details

The most well-known detail concerning the rebuild plan was the inclusion of numerous green spaces and parks, with 42% of those that claimed to have a reasonable knowledge of the plan citing them. This was followed by details of newly planned facilities with a third of respondents (34%) able to recount plans for a new stadium, convention centre or other specific building.

Other popular details included the division of the city into different precincts (17%), height restrictions on the buildings (16%) and the smaller, more compact nature of the planned CBD (14%). A smaller number of people were vague with details, 13% were aware there was some kind of plan for redevelopment and 10% knew generally where buildings were going to be located or what types of buildings may be built. A further 10% had seen the plans or blueprints and 9% relied on knowledge gained from the media. Nine percent also mentioned that the council would have to buy back land to complete its vision for development.

#### Support for rebuild plan

Over 80% of residents either support (56%) or are neutral (26%) towards the plan to rebuild the Christchurch central city area, with 27% strongly supporting the plan. Only 13% oppose the plan.

Those with a higher self declared knowledge of the plan were also more likely to support the plan, with almost half (48%) of those that knew 'a lot' strongly supporting it. Of those that knew a reasonable amount about the plan, two thirds (66%) declared support. Residents that believe it is a good time to invest in Christchurch city were also more likely to support the plan with 64% proclaiming support and one third a strong level of support.

Additionally, those with a larger household income (85% of those over \$100,000) and professionals or technicians (67% and 70% respectively) were more likely to support the plan. Blue collar workers were less likely to support the plan (42%), and over a quarter (27%) of those with less than \$30,000 (household income) oppose the plan.

#### Appetite for investing in Christchurch city

Three out of five respondents (61%) thought it was a good time to invest in the city and 22% thought it was a bad time. The remaining 17% were unsure. This compares with 50% nationally thinking is was a good time to invest in Christchurch, 37% thinking it was a bad time and 13% unsure.

Those that declared they knew 'a lot' about the plan were more likely to believe it was a good time to invest in the city (72%), however there was no difference in opinion between those that knew a 'fair amount' and those that knew 'not that much' (61% and 60% respectively). Residents that supported the plan were also more likely to believe it was a good time to invest (70%) and those that opposed the plan were more likely to believe it was a bad time (43%). Almost half (49%) of those that planned to leave Christchurch thought it was a bad time to invest in the city.

Respondents between 30 and 44, with a household income over \$100,000 and professionals were all more likely to believe it was a good time to invest (70%, 73% and 74% respectively).

#### Intention to stay in Christchurch

The vast majority of respondents (88%) plan to continue living in Christchurch over the next few years, 9% think they will move and 3% were unsure. This compares with 86% nationally planning to continue to keep living in the same area of New Zealand for the next few years.

Not surprisingly, residents that supported the rebuild plan and those that think it is a good time to invest were more likely to stay in the area (92% and 93% respectively). Older respondents (45 years and over) were also more likely to stay (93%).

Those that oppose the plan or believed it was a bad time to invest were more likely to be thinking about leaving Christchurch (17% and 21% respectively). Furthermore, respondents with hardly any knowledge of the rebuild plan were most likely to be thinking of relocating, although three quarters (76%) of them still planned on staying. Younger respondents (less than 30 years) were also more likely to leave (21%), which compares with 22% of younger New Zealanders nationally planning to leave their city.
