## Official Information Act request relating to cost savings proposal documents (follow up request)

Thank you for your Official Information Act 1982 (the Act) request received on 30 May 2024. You requested:
"I refer to your response to my following request that was lodged on 11 April: Copies of all proposal documents prepared to give effect to the Government's directive to reduce expenditure in the public service, including but not limited to reduction of staff numbers and resulting redundancies. If no such specific proposal document exists, please provide copies of all documents concerning the reduction of staff and redundancies from 27 November 2023 to present. Your response indicated that information and/or document(s) were withheld due to active consideration / budget sensitivities. As the budget is now public, I repeat my request above, now for any material from 27 November 2023 to 30 May 2024 (inclusive)."

I have interpreted your request for formal documents prepared by the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet (DPMC), including the National Emergency Management Agency, a department agency hosted by DPMC, relating to the Government's Fiscal Sustainability Programme. I have also interpreted your request for documents covering the time frame 27 November 2023 to 30 May 2024.

There is one additional document, Briefing: Portfolio priorities and savings proposals dated 19 January 2024 to Hon Mark Mitchell, Minister for Emergency Management and Recovery, covered by your request that I have decided to withhold in full under section $9(2)(\mathrm{g})(\mathrm{i})$ of the Act - to maintain the effective conduct of public affairs through the free and frank expression of opinion.

In making my decision, I have considered the public interest considerations in section 9(1) of the Act. No public interest has been identified that would be sufficient to outweigh the reasons for withholding the information.

You have the right to ask the Ombudsman to investigate and review my decision under section 28(3) of the Act.

This response will be published on DPMC's website during our regular publication cycle. Typically, information is released monthly, or as otherwise determined. Your personal information including name and contact details will be removed for publication.

## Background

## Public service savings requirements

9. On Monday 11 December 2023, Cabinet agreed to apply savings requirements across the public service.
10. The baseline figure used to calculate DPMC's savings contribution was inflated by the inclusion of money provided to address the "future of severely affected locations" (i.e., timelimited funding to help respond to the consequences of extreme North Island weather events).
11. A remedial process is underway, led by Treasury, to formalise a lower savings contribution on a corrected baseline. We expect this process to revise DPMC's savings target down s9(2)(g)(i)

DPMC's savings exercise
15. DPMC has been running a baseline savings exercise for some weeks in anticipation of an explicit savings requirement. We are well-placed to identify options and impacts of reducing expenditure at different levels.

Background

## Delivering DPMC's required savings package

9. DPMC (excluding NEMA) is required to contribute $\$ 3.244$ million to the Government's savings exercise. We have developed a $\$ 3.244$ million savings package that reduces expenditure on people, property, operational budgets, and one significant item of non-departmental expenditure.
10. The savings package is summarised in table 1 below, identifying two items that will require your agreement (these are discussed in detail below).

## Detailed choices to support DPMC's savings package

11. As noted above, two elements of DPMC's proposed savings package require your agreement before submission to the Minister of Finance. These are detailed in the following sub-sections.

## Cyber Security

12. There is an annual $\$ 1.964$ million Cyber Security appropriation that currently funds a mix of staffing (approximately $\$ 720 \mathrm{k}$ ) and programmes (approximately $\$ 1.2$ million; grants are made to applicants who present programme proposals).
13. Your agreement is sought to reducing the amount of programme funding available by $\$ 500 \mathrm{k}$ per annum, s 9 (2)(g)(i) There is currently sufficient unallocated funding available within 2024/25 to achieve this reduction.

## Centre of Excellence for Preventing and Countering Violent Extremism

14. There is a $\$ 2.150$ million non-departmental appropriation for a National Centre of Research Excellence for Preventing and Countering Violent Extremism (Centre) hosted by Victoria University of Wellington (VUW).
15. This initiative was established in response to recommendation 14 of the Royal Commission of Inquiry into the terrorist attack on Christchurch masjidain on 15 March 2019 (RCOI). This recommendation related to funding for independent, New Zealand-specific research on the causes of, and measures to prevent, violent extremism and terrorism.
16. $\$ 500 \mathrm{k}$ of this funding covers the operating costs of the Centre (primarily VUW staffing costs), while the remaining $\$ 1.65$ million is allocated for research (including scholarships and projects). The funding for research was $\$ 825 \mathrm{k}$ in $2022 / 23$ and doubled to the full $\$ 1.65$ million in 2023/24.


## Next steps

45. We will provide you with further advice on a package for submission into the government-wide savings exercise, reflecting your decisions made in response to this paper.
46. If you opt to pursue a bid in Budget 2024, we will provide you a draft letter for sending to the Minister of Finance and develop a new initiative template for submission on 16 February alongside the savings package.

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## Purpose

1. This paper provides a high-level update on the likely impacts of the Budget 2024 savings package for the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet (DPMC) and the steps taken to mitigate and manage them.

## DPMC has an implementation pathway to secure savings

2. Since our most recent advice to you on Budget 2024 options [DPMC-2023/24-949 refers] and confirmation of Budget decisions, we have prepared an implementation pathway to secure the savings identified. The savings are consistent with your desire to focus DPMC on its core role.
3. The savings will reduce the baseline by across the Vote: $\$ 3.244 \mathrm{~m}$ for DPMC appropriations, $\mathrm{s} 9(2)(\mathrm{f})(\mathrm{iv}), \mathrm{s} 9(2)(\mathrm{g})(\mathrm{i})$

## Internal changes have been activated

4. Budget 2024 initiatives that require human resources processes are underway:

- disestablishment of the Strategy Unit (staff consultation is underway)

5. The agreed transfer of the Child Wellbeing and Child Poverty Reduction Group to the Ministry of Social Development takes place on 25 April 2024 and staff consultation is complete. The reduction in the baseline funding that was agreed in relation to this transfer will be confirmed in the Budget 2024 package, along with other appropriation changes.
