1	<p><b>Welcome and Chair's update</b></p> <p>The Chair noted that DPMC was preparing a BIM for the RCOI response. He also noted that a small group meeting would be convened to discuss the upcoming fifth anniversary of the attacks to help inform advice to the incoming government.</p>
2	<p><b>RCOI response stocktake / future priorities</b></p> <p>DPMC shared information on the stocktake it had done on progress and framework for measuring progress that could be used across the whole response. This would help inform the incoming government of next steps.</p> <p>Kāpuia Secretariat mentioned that a diagram showing how much funding has been received over the course of the response could also be useful in explaining the story.</p>
3	<p><b>Update from Kāpuia Secretariat</b></p> <p>The last Kāpuia meeting was on 30 August. The group had a conversation on what had worked well so far in terms of the RCOI response and what to advise the incoming government.</p>
