TARGET DELIVERY ACTIONS

The Government is committed to providing timely access to quality healthcare for all New Zealanders.

The Government has appointed a Health NZ Commissioner focused on resetting the way Health NZ operates primarily to address unacceptable wait times.

Health NZ target implementation plan focuses on actions to:

- Increase delivery of elective treatments.
- Increase timely access to planned care.
- Address unwarranted variation in access to planned care to ensure more consistent access to services across the country.
- Improved communications to patients about their planned treatment.
- Improve the way primary and community providers work together, such as improving access to radiology.

Health NZ continues to outsource procedures to the private sector, including a minimum of 20,000 general, 2,000 orthopaedic and 3,000 cataract surgeries.
