

TARGET DELIVERY ACTIONS

The Government is focused on restoring law and order, to ensure all New Zealanders feel safe in their communities.

The New Zealand Crime and Victims' Survey (NZCVS) asks respondents of their experience of reported and unreported crime over the past 12 months. Due to the way that the information is captured and reported, any violent crime reported in the latest result could have been experienced between July 2022 and June 2024, up to two years ago.

The Government is focused on:

- Increasing the chance of violent offenders being caught and held to
 account. The Government is moving at pace on a package of measures that
 includes limiting sentencing discounts and establishing new aggravating factors
 that respond to retail crime and victimisation of sole charge workers (such as
 staff working in diaries, bus drivers, taxi drivers) through the Sentencing
 Reform Amendment Bill. This builds on the Government's Three Strikes, and
 Gang Harm legislation.
- Targeting resources to where they are needed by increasing Police numbers, Police presence in communities, and giving Police the tools they need to do their jobs effectively.
- **Breaking the cycle of violence** through supporting victims of serious crime and expanding rehabilitation services to people on remand.
