

TARGET DELIVERY ACTIONS

The Prime Minister and Minister of Education announced the Government's new Maths Action Plan 'Make it Count', followed by stronger accountability measures for school boards, and is driving Structured Literacy in schools.

The Government has six priorities focused on lifting achievement:

- Clearer curriculum updating the New Zealand Curriculum and Te Marautanga o Aotearoa (national curriculum for students learning through Te Reo) and a new knowledge rich maths/pāngarau curriculum for Years 0-8 Term 1, 2025.
- Better approach to literacy and numeracy refocus on structured approaches
 to literacy and numeracy underpinned by the science of learning.
- Smarter assessment and reporting building a consistent, coherent system
 of assessment and aromatowai (Māori approaches to monitoring progress and
 achievement).
- Improved teacher training the majority of teachers will be trained in structured approaches to literacy/te reo matatini by December 2024, ready for Years 0-6 in 2025.
- Stronger learning support redesigning and finalising the model for new Structured Literacy interventions for struggling readers.
- Greater use of data to improve the monitoring and evaluation of services and interventions across the education system.
