Proposed Overseas Travel: Rt Hon Christopher Luxon, 9-12 October 2024

1 I seek Cabinet approval to undertake official travel to Vientiane, Lao PDR from 9 October to 12 October 2024 to engage with regional partners through the East Asia Summit.

Purpose of travel

- The Government continues to prioritise engagement with Southeast Asia, given the region is critical to building and maintaining New Zealand's security and prosperity. Lao PDR, as 2024 Chair of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN), will host the annual ASEAN Summits, including the 19th East Asia Summit, of which New Zealand is a participant.
- This visit to Lao PDR supports the government's plan to increase New Zealand's focus and resources in our important relationships with ASEAN and with Southeast Asia. New Zealand is an engaged and constructive partner to ASEAN, with an interest in its strength and success. New Zealand has cultivated a reputation based on respect, reliability, and our support for ASEAN's centrality in the region. New Zealand's relationship with ASEAN plays a mutually reinforcing role in our bilateral engagement with individual ASEAN Member States.

Objectives

- 4 I will use the opportunity of these meetings to pursue a number of objectives:
 - 4.1 Confirm an ASEAN-NZ Commemorative Leaders' Summit be held in 2025 and advance New Zealand's intention to establish a Comprehensive Strategic Partnership with ASEAN at that meeting;
 - 4.2 Engage in targeted bilateral meetings intended to advance New Zealand's interests;
 - 4.3 Demonstrate New Zealand's value as a trade and investment partner in the Indo-Pacific, particularly in the ASEAN region.
- These objectives seek to ensure we are positioning ourselves in the Indo-Pacific in a manner which reflects the importance of the region to our security and prosperity, and which recognises that many of the most critical strategic threats facing New Zealand emanate from this region. Ensuring we retain an active and credible seat in this Leader-level interaction remains fundamental to our national interests. In seeking to establish a Comprehensive Strategic Partnership with ASEAN in 2025, the 50th anniversary of ASEAN-New Zealand dialogue relations, we will ensure this reflects the nature and unique character of New Zealand's partnership with ASEAN.

Deliverables

- 6 During the visit I expect to:
 - 6.1 Confirm and announce with ASEAN the scheduling of an ASEAN New Zealand Commemorative Leaders' Summit in Malaysia in November 2025;

- 6.2 Advance Leaders' awareness of New Zealand's intentions to elevate our partnership with ASEAN, particularly through establishing an ambitious and future-focused Comprehensive Strategic Partnership;
- Reinvigorate New Zealand engagement in the East Asia Summit the premier leaders' forum for discussing geopolitical issues in the Indo-Pacific.

Outline of proposed visit

- 7 In Lao PDR, I will travel to Vientiane and undertake the following engagements:
 - 7.1 Bilateral meetings with counterparts (subject to scheduling), which may include ASEAN Leaders, dialogue partners, and other representatives present;
 - 7.2 Leaders' Gala Dinner hosted by HE Sonexay Siphandone, Prime Minister of the Lao PDR:
 - 7.3 Keynote address at the ASEAN Business and Investment Summit;
 - 7.4 The 19th East Asia Summit.
- If travel is approved, I will travel to and from Lao PDR using the New Zealand Defence Force B757 aircraft. A media delegation will also accompany.

Prime Ministerial party

- I will be accompanied by two members of staff from my office. Our costs will be met by Vote Internal Affairs: Members of the Executive Travel.
- I will be accompanied by officials from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade and the Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet. Their costs will be covered by their respective departments.
- 11 I will also be accompanied by New Zealand Police Dignitary Protection Service staff, whose costs will be met by Vote Police.

Acting Ministers

If my travel is approved, I propose that Hon David Seymour act as Prime Minister, Minister Responsible for Ministerial Services and Minister for National Security and Intelligence on 9 October 2024, and Rt Hon Winston Peters act in those roles from 10-12 October 2024.

- 1 I recommend that Cabinet:
 - 1.1 Authorise my absence from New Zealand from 9-12 October 2024 to travel to Vientiane, Lao PDR;
 - 1.2 Agree that I be accompanied by two members of staff, and officials from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade, the Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet, and the New Zealand Police Dignitary Protection Services;
 - 1.3 Approve the estimated expenditure of S 9(2)(f)(iv) for the travel expenses of the Prime Ministerial party, as a charge to Vote Internal Affairs, Members of the Executive Travel;
 - 1.4 Note that I will be accompanied by officials from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade and the Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet, and New Zealand Police Dignitary Protection Services officers, whose travel costs will be a charge to their respective Votes;
 - 1.5 Agree that in my absence,
 - 1.5.1 Hon David Seymour will act as Prime Minister, Minister Responsible for Ministerial Services and Minister for National Security and Intelligence on 9 October 2024.
 - 1.5.2 Rt Hon Winston Peters will act as Prime Minister, Minister Responsible for Ministerial Services and Minister for National Security and Intelligence from 10-12 October 2024.

Proposed Overseas Travel: Prime Minister - October 2024

Portfolio Prime Minister

On 23 September 2024, Cabinet:

- 1 authorised the absence of the Prime Minister from New Zealand, from 9 to 12 October 2024, to travel to Vientiane, Lao PDR to attend the East Asia Summit and undertake bilateral meetings;
- 2 agreed that he be accompanied by two staff members;
- **approved** the estimated expenditure of up to solution for the travel expenses of the 3 ministerial party as a charge to Vote Internal Affairs (Members of the Executive – Travel);
- 4 **noted** that he will also be accompanied by:
 - 4.1 officials from the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade, and Dignitary Protection Services officers, whose travel costs will be met by their agencies;
 - 4.2 a media delegation, whose costs will be met personally;
- 5 **noted** that the Prime Minister's accommodation costs will be met by the Lao Government;
- 6 **noted** that the ministerial party and delegation is expected to travel on a New Zealand Defence Force aircraft;
- 7 agreed that in his absence,
 - 7.1 Hon David Seymour act as Prime Minister, Minister Responsible for Ministerial Services and Minister for National Security and Intelligence on 9 October 2024;
 - 7.2 Rt Hon Winston Peters act as Prime Minister, Minister Responsible for Ministerial Services and Minister for National Security and Intelligence on 10 to 12 October 2024.
