GOVERNOR-GENERAL'S TRAVEL TO THE UNITED KINGDOM

Proposal

- 1 Cabinet is asked to note that the Governor-General, Her Excellency The Rt Hon Dame Cindy Kiro, will travel to the United Kingdom to attend the coronation of King Charles III and related events from 3 to 8 May 2023.

Summary

- 2 At the invitation of the Prime Minister, the Governor-General undertakes a programme of international travel, representing New Zealand in the Head of State role (Cabinet Manual 2017, paragraph 1.13).

- 3 The principal purpose of the visit is for the Governor-General to attend the coronation of the King of New Zealand, King Charles III, and associated events, as the head of the New Zealand delegation.

- 5 The Governor-General will be accompanied s9(2)(a) by Dr Richard Davies and two Government House staff (the Official Secretary and an Aide-de-Camp) and s6(d) Protection Service officers.

- 6 s9(2)(a)

Travel

- 7 The Governor-General and accompanying officials will travel to and from the United Kingdom on commercial flights.

Financial implications

- 8 The cost of the visit is approximately s9(2)(f)(i), s9(2)(f)(iv). The costs comprise s9(2)(f)(i), s9(2)(f)(iv) for flights and s9(2)(f)(i), s9(2)(f)(iv) for accommodation and incidental expenses for the official party from Government House, excluding the Protection Service officers.

- 9 The costs for the Governor-General and party will be met from the permanent legislative authority in Vote Prime Minister and Cabinet for the travel expenses of the Governor-General under section 14 of the Governor-General Act 2010.

- 10 The expenses of the Protection Service officers will be met from Vote Police.

Consultation

- 11 The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade has been consulted in the development and implementation of the Governor-General's programme and this Cabinet paper.

Proactive release

- 12 This paper will be proactively released, subject to any redactions.

Administrator of the Government

- 13 During the absence of the Governor-General the Chief Justice, Rt Hon Dame Helen Winkelmann, will act as Administrator of the Government.

Recommendations

It is recommended that Cabinet:

1. **note** that the Governor-General will travel to the United Kingdom to attend the coronation of the King of New Zealand, King Charles III, and related events from 3 to 8 May 2023;
2. **note** that the Governor-General will be accompanied ^{s9(2)(a)} by Dr Richard Davies, the Official Secretary, and an Aide-de-Camp from Government House, and ^{s6(d)} Protection Service officers;
3. **note** that the total cost of the visit for the Governor-General's party from Government House to the United Kingdom will be approximately ^{s9(2)(f), s9(2)(iv)} ;
4. **note** that these costs will be met from the appropriation under permanent legislative authority in Vote Prime Minister and Cabinet for the travel expenses of the Governor-General under section 14 of the Governor-General Act 2010; however, the travel expenses of the ^{s6(d)} Protection Service officers will be met from Vote Police;
5. **note** that in the absence of the Governor-General the Chief Justice, Rt Hon Dame Helen Winkelmann, will act as Administrator of the Government.

- 5 **noted** that the costs in paragraph 4 above will be met from the appropriation under permanent legislative authority in Vote Prime Minister and Cabinet for the travel expenses of the Governor-General under section 14 of the Governor-General Act 2010;
- 6 **noted** that in the absence of the Governor-General the Chief Justice, Rt Hon Dame Helen Winkelmann, will act as Administrator of the Government.
