Official Information Act request relating to designation of residential red zones

Thank you for your Official Information Act 1982 (the Act) request received on 11 March 2025. You requested:

"I hope this email finds you well. My name is Natsuki Yamada, and I am a student of university of Otado. I am currently researching the Canterbury Earthquakes and the planning processes related to the residential red zone.

I would like to gain a deeper understanding of how the residential red zone was designated following the earthquakes. In particular, I am interested in the key considerations that were taken into account during the designation process. For example, I would like to know whether factors such as disaster risk (e.g., earthquakes, tsunamis, liquefaction, and floods) and geographical conditions were evaluated, and if so, how these factors influenced the decision-making process.

If there are any official guidelines, reports, or resources available on this topic, I would greatly appreciate it if you could share them with me. Additionally, if there is someone within your organization who specializes in this area, I would be grateful for any recommendations on whom I could contact for further information.
